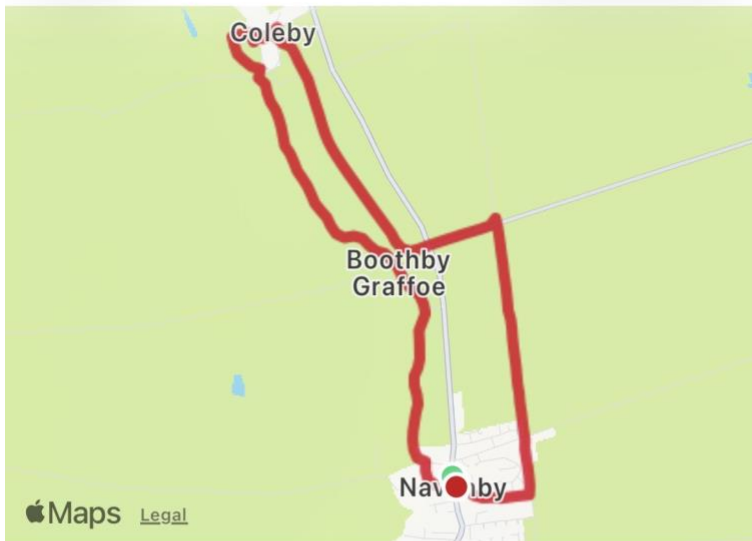


19th March 2026
